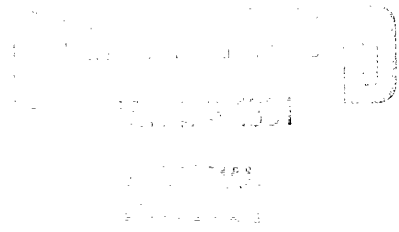

Tumon Pillbox II (66-04-1206)

The Tumon Pillbox II is located along Tumon Bay directly inland from the channel through the reef and 6.0m inland from the high tide line. Constructed of reinforced concrete, the structure is in good condition.

The pillbox measures approximately 2.50m by 2.50m. The entrance walls extend about .75m from the south or landward wall. The west side of the entrance is damaged. The north wall, .45m thick, has a gun which has a view of Tumon Bay. The east wall, about .30m thick, has a window looking towards the east portion of Tumon Bay. The west wall, .40m thick, has no opening. The roof is .36m thick. Over the entrance, along the northern wall, the roof has been reinforced by the addition of .15m to .20m of roofing material. Coral rocks are cemented to the top of the roof. Perhaps the addition of the rocks was an attempt to camouflage the structure against detection by air.

The interior space forms one room. Presently the ceiling of the interior is 1.15m above the sandy floor. A gun rest is located on the interior of the north wall under the gun port. Horizontal impressions of the boards used to build the form into which the concrete was poured are apparent on the interior and exterior walls of the structure.
