

Shelby St. facade once had porch across entire front, now enclosed but posts still visible. Building is L-plan, rear extension is 3 bay. Once had L-shaped porch in rear joint. 19. History Railroad came to Falmouth in 1854. Abdelah Watson built this hotel in 1857, to serve train passengers. Guests of the hotel watched the 1869 eclipse from front porch.
