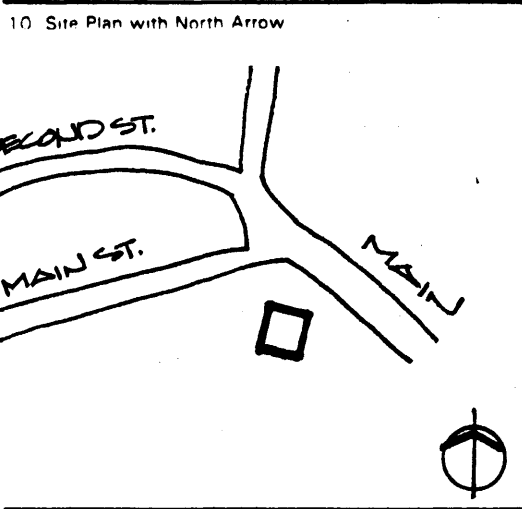

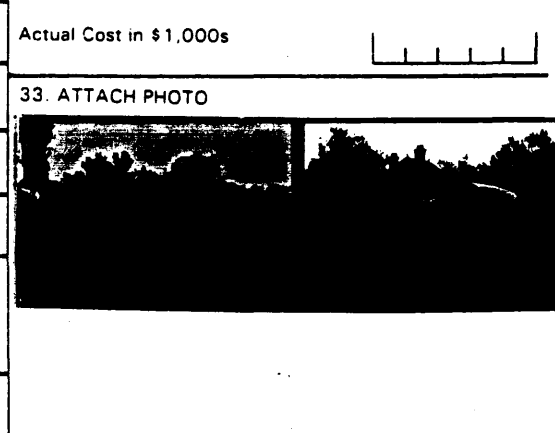

19 History Originally owned by Allie & Helen Preston Webb. House built in 1901 by Henry Conley, well known contractor. F.S. Van Hoose married Webb's daughter and this became their home. F.S. Van Hoose started the Van Hoose Lumber Company in Depot Street in the 1920's which was one of the largest lumber companies in eastern Kentucky. He was also an automobile dealer and civic leader. 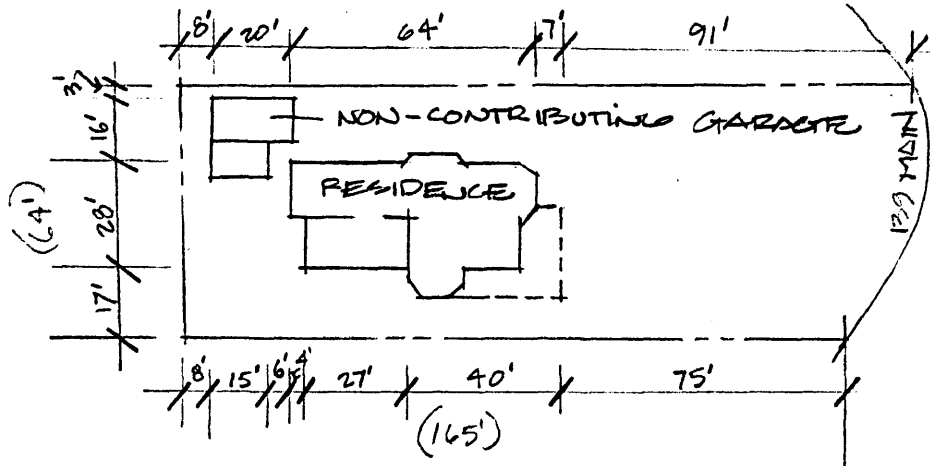
