of the mill, but not connected to it is a tall square tapered stone chimney with a brick top. 40 feet E of these along a rock fence is the warehouse: (photo 5)

The first story is of quarried stone w some tooling, heavy corners; sawn joists. The 3 openings are spanned by timber lintels, have narrow frames, and double diagonal batten doors - narrow boards and mitered stiles. 2nd floor is frame with matching fenestration plus 1 window on the end. Roof has overhang on eaves and gables. Masonry has been painted with a <sup>stained</sup> grapevine joint, probably later. (photo 3)

Miller's house is up hill from mill site.

Site is reached by a lane along the top of the creek bank & has good rock fence all along it on the other side. (photo 4)

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A on the creek bank 15 ft N of the stone chimney, thence E 200 ft to the NE corner of the warehouse, thence along back wall of warehouse and fence 5132 ft to a corner post, thence W and SW 210 ft to the creek, thence W creek NW to the beginning, containing the stone warehouse, mill foundation, and chimney - about 3/4 acre.
