Four Corinthian tetrastyle entrances give a sense of grandeur to the exterior of the Ben Hill County Courthouse. Built on an acre lot which was the original public square, the building is located today on a secondary street. The pediments of the entrances have a foliate design with center cartouches, Baroque in spirit. Pilasters are on the corners of the building and a ballustrade crowns the roof.

The cross-styled plan utilizes grey marble in the interior.

The courtroom has been renovated and modernized recently. The ceiling was lowered and the tops of the pilasters were covered to the detriment of the spatial balance of the room. The jury box is now placed at an angle to the judges bench and faces the witness stand.
