In 1887 The Common Council of Baton Rouge contracted with E. Smedley and John H. Wood of Dubuque, Iowa, authorizing them to "build, construct, maintain, operate and own water works in the said City of Baton Rouge." In 1888 the standpipe was built, 100 feet in height and 15 feet in diameter, on a leased piece of ground adjoining the water works lot.

The standpipe is of riveted wrought iron plates varying in thickness from 5/8 inch at the bottom to 1/4 inch at the top. It stands on a 10 foot deep foundation with fabricated triangular brackets at the base. Ornamental cresting adorned the top, and an access ladder was attached to the sides. The standpipe was extended in 1937, when plates were added to give the present 110 foot height and in 1938 the present metal umbrella roof was added, replacing the originally designed wooden cover.

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The appearance of the standpipe today is essentially the same as the original, except for the added height. Original capacity was 132,500 gallons, present capacity is 145,750 gallons.

This standpipe was the original and only elevated water storage facility for the Baton Rouge Water Works Company supply from 1888 until 1938 when Margaret Street Tank was erected. The standpipe served during the time treated Mississippi River water was the source of supply. However in 1889 the first well was drilled, and in 1896 a second deeper well provided better quality water for Baton Rouge.

The standpipe is unusual today in that it is constructed of wrought iron, while modern tanks are constructed of steel.

The standpipe was in service from 1888 until 1963, and has not been used for water storage since that time. It is 75 years old this year.
