




## 45. Description and House Plan:

The residence is a two-story, three-bay frame structure with interior brick chimneys. Windows are double with 1/1 glazing. The floor plan is one room deep, each side of a central hall. The eaves of the hip roof overhang the cornice which is ornamented with brackets. A wooden pilaster defines the corner of the residence. A two-story portico covers the central entry bay. Double-leaf front doors are framed by transom and sidelights. A two-story frame ell extends to the rear joining the main floors of the house to a one-story frame and log kitchen which has an exterior stone and brick chimney.

Modern modifications to the house include stone terraces on either side of the front front porch, enclosure of part of the ell, and an addition of bathrooms as noted in the floorplan in #44. These modifications do not, however, detract from the sense of place or integrity of the building.

### Significance Statement

The Burris House is significant under Criterion C for the period ca. 1870 as an example of how Mercer County builders used elements from both the Greek Revival and the Italianate styles to ornament a single pile, central passage house. The elements of the Greek Revival style are found in the pilasters on the corners of the house, portico, and wide cornice, while the elements of the Italianate style are found in the wide eaves and brackets, and low hip roof.

## Verbal Boundary Justification

The yard-fence was chosen as the boundary because it encloses the only contributing element within the nomination and provides a strong visual demarcation of a setting for the house.

The nominated area contains one contributing building.
