#### 45. Description and House Plan:

One and three-fourth story, three-bay, hall-parlor, dry-stone house, size 24' x 33'; interior chimneys each end. House has more height than usual above first floor windows allowing more second floor headroom; full-size windows upstairs beside chimneys (photo #1). Upstairs windows pegged; beaded tapered gable boards (photo #1); pegged frame door in northeast end wall; chisel marks on stones, more prominent at corners; no voussoirs.

Large fireplace in northeast end, used for cooking; enclosed corner stair along partition wall, arises from southwest room; fireplace in every room. "1818 Abe Souther" carved in log joists; vertical diamond-barred cellar window.

House has been repointed with concrete; first floor windows lengthened and replaced with narrow mitered-corner frames; formerly had chair rail, interior now remodelled. A turn of the century, two-room frame addition on rear has enclosed shed porch on northeast side—all in poor condition. These have not damaged the stone house.

Souther cemetery near house. No significant outbuildings; modern garage. Present farm is 112 acres. Located near summit of knoll draining to branch of Elijah's Creek and steep descent to Ohio River.

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
