DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Montpelier Historic District is comprised of four buildings: the city hall, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints' stake tabernacle and the high school with its gymnasium. These buildings front on Washington Avenue and are distinct from the surrounding residential area in their scale, materials, and function. All are two-stories high, constructed of brick and set back from the street on large lots with ample lawns, mature shrubbery and evergreens.

The neo-classical revival style city hall (1) is the oldest building in the district and is distinguished by its portico with pairs of Tuscan columns. It was built at a cost of \$25,000 of buff brick made by the Ogden, Utah, Pressed brick and Tile Company. A year after the city hall's completion the semi-circular L.D.S. tabernacle (2) was begun (1918) on the adjacent corner. This \$50,000 red brick structure employs classical motifs including round arched entries with ornate terra cotta tympanums. The tabernacle is the city's largest auditorium. The moderne style high school (4) was constructed in 1937 as a \$160,000 Public Works Administration project on the land opposite the tabernacle. Constructed of mountain red variegated tapestry brick, the building is distinguished by its extensive and profusely ornamented terra cotta trim.

The high school gymnasium (3), a simple, 1960's utilitarian styled building is the only intrusion in the district, although it is compatible with the earlier structures in its scale, material and landscaping.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Montpelier Historic District is architecturally significant with its substantial brick buildings, the major structures in the city. The heart of Montpelier's community life reposes within these buildings, which is well reflected in their scale, design, craftsmanship and landscaping.

The buildings were designed by some of the area's major architects. The prominent Pocatello firm of Boyer and Rogers designed the city hall in 1916 and the contract went to Pocatello's major contractor, J. F. Murray. Salt Lake architects Pope and Burton designed the Stake Tabernacle building. This firm made the plans for many Utah and southeast Idaho L.D.S. tabernacles including the semi-circular buildings at Blackfoot, Idaho, and Richfield, Utah. The high school building was the second largest PWA school building project in Idaho and is one of the finest moderne buildings in the state rendered in brick. Its architect, Frank H. Paradise of Pocatello, was an 1899 graduate from Chicago's Art Institute and Armour Institute of Technology. Prior to moving to Pocatello he had offices in Denver, Portland, and Boise. He designed the first buildings at the College of Idaho, the Blackfoot High School and many buildings in Pocatello.




