19. History Samuel and William Lampton emigrated from England in 1750. Settled first in VA, then to KY (related to Earl of Durham-brother); lived first Lincoln County then Winchester, (Wm): nephew Mark Twain-Samuel Clemens: son James Lampton lived here, who was born in Winchester 1787, married 1810 to Susan Ryon; there grandson William James Lampton, columnist; owned also by Ballard. Wills 1877 Atlas			
20. Significance Home for many years of the James Lampton, whose family immigrated to Winchester from Lincoln County, Virginia this is a modest three-bay, Flemish-bond brick building.
