with buttress stone; fine gilded corners. Pegged window frames; basement windows have log lintels and pegged frames w horizontal diamond bars.

Entrance corner stair arises from 5 ~~steps~~ in hall along partition wall, space taken from parlor. Partition w oak lath, plaster. 1 2-pane door, 1 6-pane door, chair rail, sawn joists, split lath. Stone wing abuts log wall on W end of house. Log house exterior chimney enlarged to accommodate fireplace back to back; now is interior chimney of stone wing.

Log house has excellent dovetail matched corners, large exterior stone chimneys each end. A portion of the log walls have been removed to allow access for hay storage. (photo 6)

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A where the fence begins to curve, thence N 110 ft perpendicular to front wall of house to B, thence at a right angle to A-B to lake shore and with lake shore ^(Willow) a total of 270 ft to C, thence ^S parallel to A-B to fence, thence with fence E to the beginning containing about 2/3 acre.
Other barns nearby nearby are later.
