Pegged frames, square sills. Mantle gone, interior woodwork replaced, no chair rail; interior walls have thick whitewash and paint on stone; one piece of ovslo trim remains on N. door. Two windows in SE side, 2 doors NW side, no end or attic windows.

House located on bluff above N. Ashorn Creek. Steep ravine E of house has pond w early stone dam w buttresses; rock fencing descending to ravine below dam, gateway at lowest point.

House is located 1/3 mi. away from mansion house; however, the form looks like quarters. Possibly a miller's house?

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at a point 150 ft due W from the SW corner of the stone house, thence parallel w. front of house 500 ft NE to B, thence at a right angle 400 ft SE to the bank of N. Elkhorn, thence with creek 550 ft SSW to D, thence parallel to B-C 600 ft NW to the beginning, containing the stone house, stone dam and rock fencing, about 5 3/4 acres.
