The only known pictorial record of the Willamette Station of the Methodist Mission in Oregon was made in September 1841 by Henry Eld, Jr., a Passed Midshipman attached to the United States Exploring Expedition under the command of Lieutenant Charles Wilkes, U.S.Navy. Eld's view of the Mission buildings, looking west toward the Willamette River, was the basis of this wood








