Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The old Excelsior Public School Building is situated on a quarter-block site approximately two blocks east of the central business district of Excelsior. The site occupies a prominent knoll that slopes to the east and south of the building. The northern one-third of the site is a parking lot used by the building's occupants.

The building is a two story eclectic brick structure placed on a high limestone basement and has an expansive hipped-roof attic. It is rectangular in plan and contains approximately 15,000 square feet divided equally among the basement, first, and second levels. All facades are symmetrical in arrangement.

The principal (west) facade is most articulated in terms of architectural design. A three story tower with open belfry figures prominently into the symmetrical composition. The main entrance, a semi-circular arched portal with double doors and transom, is located at the base of the tower. Windows are embellished with stone sills and lintels; second floor windows are accented by blank arches above the lintels. Additional window treatments include Palladian dormers and a bulls-eye in the tower. The roof of the belfry is octagonal with an ogee curve.

The structure no longer serves as a classroom facility. The original eight classrooms were subdivided into offices in 1964. Also accomplished at that time were lowering of ceilings and reduction of window size by blocking out upper sash with panels. The exterior of the structure has been sandblasted.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Erected in 1899-1901, nearly a half-century after the first school was organized in Excelsior, the old Excelsior Public School building is a significant reminder of the expansion, development, and quest for permanence by the citizens of the community. Having evolved from simple log and frame buildings to this masonry structure of refined architectural design, the building served as the center of community life in the town. Its prominent location overlooking the central business district and the lake areas served to strengthen its symbolic importance. Today, as the seat of the Minnetonka School District 276 administrative offices, the building remains a functional local landmark. Its architectural detailing, with an eclectic combination of elements from the Romanesque, Georgian, and Renaissance styles, illustrates the qualities of dignity and restraint sought after in post-Victorian public buildings.
