Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Annesdale-Snowden Historic District is an architecturally cohesive collection of single-family dwellings and a few duplexes contained within a triangular area bordered by Interstate 255 to the west, Heistan Place to the south and Lamar Avenue to the northeast. Its original street lights (most of which are still in place), sewers and water and gas mains provide an example of the planning innovations of the early 1900's. Streetscapes remain much as they were when the South Annesdale and Snowden Homestead subdivisions were developed in 1906 and 1910; homes are set back thirty-five feet on lots that are most typically fifty feet by one hundred fifty feet. Enhancing the district's appearance are large trees along its streets.

The architecture of the Annesdale-Snowden Historic District is a record of the building styles popular between 1906 and 1929. In a reaction to the ornateness of Victorian building styles which preceded 1900, houses built in this period exhibit restraint and simplicity. The turn-of-the-century cottage, a one or one-and-onehalf story house with a veranda, the bungalow and the four-square are the styles that dominate the district. They became popular for their flexibility of plan and relative cheapness. Annesdale-Snowden is notable mainly as a visual record of the various ways in which Memphians adapted these building forms to suit their practical needs and aesthetic tastes. Most bungalows in the area are of weatherboard or brick, but there are also examples of the use of stone, stucco, shingles and concrete block. Building elements usually include large porches, tapered columns, dormers and both hip and gable roofs, many with jerkinheads. The foursquare--a box-like two or two-and-one-half story structure--features a gable or hip roof, often a bellcast hip, although an occasional gambrel roof is used. A number of the same building materials and details seen on the bungalow are used in the four-square. Many houses in the district are decorated with bracketed cornices, bay windows, transoms and sidelights, leaded and stained glass, porte cocheres, and timbering.

At first a select area for prominent Memphians, Annesdale-Snowden has emerged from the deterioration it underwent in the 1940's, 1950's and early 1960's to become once again a viable urban neighborhood in which the homes retain with few exceptions their original configuration.

Annesdale-Snowden Historic District

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Characterized by architectural cohesiveness, early twentieth-century planning innovations and historical ties to influential Memphians of the same era, the Annesdale-Snowden Historic District—a combination of the South Annesdale and Snowden Homestead subdivisions developed by the Snowden family—is a remarkably intact and distinct enclave separated from later development by the barriers of Interstate 255 to its west, Lamar Avenue to the northeast and Heistan Place to the south. These streets and highway provide distinct boundaries and serve as buffer zones, separating the district from more recent commercial and residential growth.

The origins of the area can be traced back to 1850. Dr. Samuel Mansfield built an Italianate mansion on the outskirts of Memphis on a knoll above Pigeon Roost Road (now Lamar Avenue), part of a stage route to Mississippi famms and plantations. In 1869, the Mansfield home was purchased by Colonel Robert C. Brinkley for his daughter, Annie Overton Brinkley, a granddaughter of John Overton, as a wedding gift to her and her new husband, Colonel Robert Bogardus Snowden. The two hundred-acre estate was named Annesdale in her honor. Colonel Snowden added to this property by remaining in Memphis during the yellow fever epidemics of 1873 and 1878 and acquiring a great deal of land for future development purposes.

Colonel Snowden and his sons, John Bayard Snowden and Robert Brinkley Snowden, were active in the Memphis business community. Colonel Snowden was president of the Bank of Commerce and the Citizen's Electric Street Railway. The sons, who became partners in the real estate firm of Snowden and Snowden, in 1903 developed what has been recognized as "the first subdivision in the South", Annesdale Park. After the success of this venture, surrounding property was subdivided and sold. This resulted in the development in 1906 of South Annesdale, bounded by Lamar, Bellevue and Woodward Avenues and the railroad. The Snowdens, as they had done in Annesdale Park, designed the subdivision with all the modern conveniences of the era--gas street lights, sewers and water, and gas mains--to attract affluent Memphians.

In 1910 the Snowden brothers broke up the estate surrounding Annesdale. The seven-and-one-half-acre home site, built in a rural setting, was being absorbed by urban growth. This new subdivision was named the Snowden Homestead. Advertised as an exclusive subdivision, lots were sold for top prices. Streets in this area were named for the Snowden children--Agnes, Dorothy, Minna, Bayard (now Central Avenue) and Brinkley (now Sledge Avenue).

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

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

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The early residents of these two subdivisions were members of the middle and upper middle classes. Enjoying the prosperity of the period (1906-1929), physicians, lawyers, bankers, contractors and owners of well-known Memphis firms as well as salesmen, clerks and carpenters built homes in Annesdale-Snowden. Throughout the teens, twenties and thirties the area remained a fashionable neighborhood. Among its more notable residents were Mr. Kemmons Wilson (1170-72 Dorothy), founder and Chairman of the Board of Holiday Inns, International; Mignon Dunn (born at 1260 Central), a mezzo soprano who in 1958 became the first Memphian, the second Tennessean and one of only a few Southerners to make the artist roster at the Metropolitan Opera; and Walk C. Jones (1214 Central), who, as a member of the firm of Jones and Furbringer, was Memphis' most prominent architect until the 1950's.

Architecturally, Annesdale-Snowden presents a cross-section of those housing styles adopted by a particular socio-economic group. The first houses constructed (1906-1911) were Queen Anne cottages; however, from 1911 to 1929 the bungalow and the four-square were the preferred building styles. The use of a variety of decorative elements (decorative cornices, bay window, leaded and stained glass, and half-timbering, for example) and building materials (stucco, brick, weatherboard, stone and shingles) provides a kaleidoscope of excellent architectural styling that articulates the preferences of the middle class prior to the Depression.

Annesdale-Snowden continued to thrive until the Depression, when a decline began. During World War II an acute housing shortage resulted in the conversion of many of the larger homes into multi-family dwellings. Zoning was changed from single to multi-family to accomodate the changing composition of the area. The deterioration continued through the 1950's and into the early 1960's, compounded by the flight to newer suburbs. However, the structural soundness and architectural quality of homes in this area as well as the tree-lined streetscapes have attracted renewed interest. In October 1975, the Annesdale-Snowden Association was formed with the goals of halting commercial encroachment and of improving the general appearance of the neighborhood. As a result of a request by this group, the Memphis City Council approved down-zoning--an action that has confirmed the area's return to its original single-family configuration. Increased neighborhood stability has resulted in the rehabilitation and maintenance of most houses in the district.

Annesdale-Snowden is remarkable for the lack of intrusions (only one among the one hundred ninety-two buildings included in the district), the obvious boundaries that make the district an easily definable entity and the continued ownership of homes by families of the original residents. Annesdale-Snowden is significant becauses its architecture conveys the essence of an early twentieth century middle class urban neighborhood.

The areas south of the southern boundary are used for industry and railroad yards; the right of way of I-240 forms the western boundary; and the area east of Heywood Street contains modern commercial buildings. The areas between Lamar Avenue and the northern boundary of the district have a few early twentieth century residences but modern commercial buildings predominate. The tract bounded by Snowden Circle and Lamar Avenue is the Snowden property which includes the antebellum Snowden mansion; this property will be nominated separately at a later date.
