7. Description:

The Willis Grimes House (BO-316) is located on the north side of the Danville and Lebanon Road (S.R. 34) at the end of a driveway. Constructed in the mid-nineteenth century, the Grimes House was originally associated with several hundred acres of agricultural farmland, but the majority of the acreage has been sold and developed commercially and that acreage remaining is not included with this nomination. Only the main residence, a contributing building, is included in the nomination, as a locally significant example of an early brick, T-plan dwelling with Italianate influences.

1.) Facing south, to the road, the **main residence** (contributing building) is a c. 1860, two-story T-plan dwelling of brick construction of common bond with queens closers. Italianate features include a low hipped roof (clad with non-original asphalt shingles), paired brackets beneath the cornice, and segmentally arched windows. Divided into three bays, the front facade has a central entry with a wood and glass door topped by an arched transom. A hipped porch with turned spindles and decorative frieze fronts the two recessed bays of the plan. A one-story bay window in the projecting bay of the "T" has triple 1/1 sash windows. Original windows are typically 2/2 sash with segmental and soldier course arches, stone keystones, impost blocks and original wood shutters (along the second story). A lower twostory ell extends from the rear (north) wall with a 5 course American bond brick pattern. Extending from the rear ell is a mid- to late-twentieth century carport with solid brick railing and brick supports. Additional features include two central interior brick chimneys and a continuous mortared cut stone foundation.

The interior plan is somewhat irregular with the central entry hall containing an open stringer staircase, flanked on either side by single pile rooms. To the rear of the center hall is a perpendicular hallway leading into ell and the single bay addition. Access was not allowed to each interior room.

8. Statement of Significance:

Located on the north side of the Danville and Lebanon Road (S.R. 34), the Grimes House (BO-316) is architecturally significant on a local level under Criterion C, as an example of a traditional T-plan embellished with popular Italianate features. Especially noteworthy is the building's front facade; with segmentally arched, tall slender windows featuring soldier course arches with stone keystones and impost blocks, bracketed cornice and polygonal bay with dentiled cornice. The facade resembles one of the main facades of the c. 1876 Nimrod I. Buster House (BO-382). The period of significance for the property is c. 1861, the approximate date of construction.

The property is nominated as part of the Multiple Property Listing titled "Historic and Architectural Resources of Boyle County, Kentucky", significant within the context "Domestic Architecture in Boyle County, 1780-1945." Willis Grimes, a successful stock farmer in the county, purchased the 213 acres originally associated with the dwelling in two transactions dated 1855 and 1858 (Boyle County Deed Book 10: 47). The nominated dwelling existed by 1865 as it is mentioned in a transaction between Grimes and S.S. Fry. In the deed, Grimes conveyed 15 acres "...being the lots of ground adjoining and near to the buildings now occupied by the said Willis Grimes (Boyle County Deed Book 9: 220)." Three years later, "...In consideration of his love and affection for his wife...and the further consideration that he has hitherto received of her estate money and property of considerable value...", Willis Grimes conveyed the trust of his 213 acres to W.W. Hill of Jefferson County, Kentucky, being the land "...the same the said Grimes now resides" (Deed Book 10: 47). Included in the conveyance were

...all of the household and kitchen furniture in the house and premises, also a buggy and rockaway and harness, also five work horses, six cows and calves and the farming utensils on the premises, to have and to hold to said Hill in trust for the sale and exclusive use and benefit of said Jane Grimes as her separate estate, with power on his part, on her written request to sell, convey, manage and dispose of the same....(I)n the meantime, she will control the same at her own good pleasure (ibid)."

The Willis Grimes dwelling presents a vernacular translation of the Italianate. It features a multitude of Italianate elements and, although perhaps not as sophisticated as other dwellings in the county (particularly the Charles T. Worthington House, BO-368), the residence is nevertheless notable as an

early rendition of the Italianate style in Boyle County. Currently, the residence retains its historic integrity through its original design, material and workmanship.

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10. Geographical Data:

Verbal Boundary Description:

The Willis Grimes House is located on the north side of State Route 34, just southwest of Danville, Kentucky. The nominated main residence is identified within the dotted lines of Parcel 6 of the accompanying Boyle County Property Identification Tax Map 35. Located in the Boyle County Property Valuation Office, the tax map has a scale of 1" = 600'.

Boundary Justification:

The boundaries identified by dotted lines on Parcel 6 include the main residence, the only remaining building historically associated with the property. The parcel acreage not included in this nomination was excluded due to loss of historic integrity through changes of land use patterns.
