so short that I could do nothing definite
if he can come probably I shall want
him by the first of 5th mo or before if the
canal should open early. I have not
purchased much yet clothes are considered
to have advanced some other goods about
the same Aunt Mary is at Westchester
I have not seen her since I returned not
heard but what she and the rest were
well - please write me on receipt of this
and oblige a friend
