

III. Physical description of property and historic significance

St. Cecilia School is a late Italianate, three-story, brick building seven bays wide with a symmetrical front entrance. The ground story is set below a water table and has segmentally arched windows. The second story, which is the main story, features a band of arched windows interrupted by the central entrance. The entrance vestibule, which is reached by means of a central stair, is set in a pedimented aedicule motif with an inscribed archway. The building has a brick cornice surmounted by a hip roof with a front facing ventilation dormer. The interiors are large and plain. The building has a rear wing which is connected by a breezeway.

St. Cecilia is locally significant in the area of architecture because it is a landmark within the town of Broussard. It is the town's tallest 50+ year old structure as well as the largest. It also has an impressive second story arcade effect. Finally, it is one of only two buildings in the town which feature a pedimented entrance.
