#108 Burns Lake Bungalow of the Los Ojos (Parkview) Hatchery,
ill. 60, one-half mile south of the Hatchery.

4. Owner: State of New Mexico, Property Control Division
(State Game and Fish Dept.), Santa Fe, NM

6. In Existing Survey: St. Reg. #1113

7. Description: concrete foundation; stone rubble walls with raked concrete joints; asphalt shingles over gable roof, wood shingles in gable ends; small overhang with exposed beams and rafters; 8 light wood casement windows with brick sills; tapered boxed porch piers with molding "bases" and "capitals". A two-car garage of the same date and construction stands 40 feet northeast of the house.

Located on a rise overlooking Burns Lake, at a point where the steep cliffs which separate the first and the second plateau dissolve into merely steep hills.

8. Significance: Since the Burns Lake House was built as part of the 1932-34 WPA Hatchery project, using the same materials, what is said in the previous entry about the significance of the main complex of the hatchery also applies in a general way to it. Since the house is smaller and located away from public roads, it is not as prominent a symbol of the presence of state government.

10. Acreage: under 1. UTM Ref: 13 358700 4064150

Boundary: A rectangle, roughly 80' by 70', formed by lines parallel to and ten feet from the S and W sides of the house and the E and N sides of its garage.
