**SIGNIFICANCE** 

Architect:

The central gabled section of this long house has angled wings to the south, for living room and owner's bedroom above, and to the north, for service. The central section has recessed entrance porch under a dark wood balcony, dining room, and on the second floor, bedrooms. The walls are rubble stone and wide, rough, chestnut clapboards in a dark finish. There are many small-paned windows; three, of oblong shape and staggered, light the stairwell. The roofline is punctuated by a truncated dormer and stone chimneys that reach above to the ridge. The plans include an ingle nook with fieldstone floor off the living room, and an outdoor pool.
