Exterior end chimney on E end,
now inside kitchen addition.
Beaded board partition wall and
Federal trim doorway; enclosed
winding stair with access from
N end of hall, space taken from
parlor.

Stone kitchen added on E end
containing cooking fireplace with (photo 3)
large log lintel. Ceiling joists
exposed, beaded; underside of (photo 4)
attic flooring also beaded. Kitchen
has exterior batten doors on N and
S sides; full size single window
in E end having had vertical
diamond bars. Gable end framed
and battened above eave level. Dry
masonry, flat and steeple pointing,
few tool marks, no dovetails, log
lintels.

House located on hillside above
Paint Lick Creek with beautiful view
of creek valley and Ky. R. palisades to
the N; branch to creek N. of house.
Rock fence around house and along
branch, some laid on diagonal. (photo 6)

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, at the foot of the hill where the rock fence meets the wire fence at a sycamore tree, thence with wire fence and beyond Northward 225 ft to the branch at B, thence with the branch E 200 ft to C, thence parallel to A-B 225 ft to D, thence with line of rock fence 200 ft W to the beginning, containing the log and stone house and rock fencing - about 1 acre.
