Summary
Constructed c. 1910, the Anderson-Hobson Mercantile Store is associated with the historic context Railroad Era Resources of Southwest Arkansas (Lafayette, Little River, Miller and Sevier Counties), 1870-1945 by virtue of its direct associations with growth experienced in Foreman as a result of the arrival of one of the railroads that played such an influential role in the growth and development of Little River County.
Elaboration Elaboration
Constructed c. 1910, the Anderson-Hobson Mercantile Store was built during the first decade of growth after the arrival of the Arkansas and Choctaw Railroad (later the Frisco line) as a commercial building. As such it is associated with the historic context Railroad Era Resources of Southwest Arkansas (Lafayette, Little River, Miller and Sevier Counties), 1870-1945 by virtue of its direct associations with growth experienced in Foreman as a result of the arrival of one of the railroads that played such an influential role in the growth and development of Little River County. It is thus significant under Criterion A as one of the few surviving buildings constructed to serve as a commercial building during the first years after the railroad's arrival in the county; it is also significant under Criterion C as the best surviving example of an Italianate commercial building in Foreman.
