Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Finsted's Auto Marine Shopis located just north of the central area of the City of Ranier, on Sand Bay of Rainy Lake.

The boat works building, situated between the alleyway at the Bay, is a rectangular gable-roofed one-and-three-quarter story structure of concrete block. Fenestration on the building consists of double hung, six-over-six windows, placed both singly and in groups. There is a large double doorway on the side facing the alley. The interior of the building consists of a shop area on the ground floor and living quarters on the second level. The shop contains much of the machinery used in the maintenance work performed at the works. Belt driven from a central power source, many components of the system were developed by Dionne and Finsted.

Immediately to the east of the building, a track with a movable platform leads from the Bay across the alley to the boat yard. Several boats remain in storage in this area.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Finsted's Auto Marine Shop is significant for its association with an important facet of Koochiching County history - tourism and seasonal residents in the Rainy Lake area. The Boat Works were constructed by Jim Dionne in 1911. George Finsted worked for Dionne from 1922 until 1924, at which time he and his brother purchased the business. The establishment is situated in the town of Ranier, located at the point where Rainy Lake empties into the Rainy River. The townsite had been platted in 1907 as the Duluth Winnipeg and Pacific Railroad was constructed across the river (the international border) to the developing pulp and paper mills at Ft. Francis, Ontario. Ranier's proximity to International Falls and its location on the rail line and Rainy Lake made it the main access point to the lake on the American side. Boat traffic on the lake consisted of vessels serving the seasonal and tourist populations and well as those used by commercial fishermen. Because of its strategic location, Finsted's provided parts and repairs for much of this traffic, as well as winter storage. From early wealthy families such as the Dahlbergs, Robertses, and Backuses, to present day vacationers, the scenic labyrinth of Rainy Lake has played host to many seasonal residents. Finsted's central role in lake transportation, and its exceptionally well preserved belt driven machinery system, make it a significant remainder of this facet of the area's history and development.
