VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, at a utility pole N of the house at a fence, thence with fence SE 190 ft to a fence corner at B, SW 270 ft to a corner at C, NW 190 ft w fence to D, thence parallel to B-C 270 ft NE to the beginning containing the stone house, about 1 1/10 acre. No significant out buildings remain.
