

This house, while having been altered through the years, still retains a sufficient amount of its original fabric that it should be recognized and retained. We are therefore including it for its architectural significance, for its association with the exploration and settlement of the Bergen County area, and for its remaining historic fabric. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.



HISTORIC NAME: Dr. Vroom House

160 East Ridgewood Avenue, Ridgewood



Since the builder or early owner is not known (1861 and 1876 names we speculators), the name "Dr. Vroom" is used as he was a famous physician of the area who lived and worked here. He was William L. Vroom of Hoboken, born in 1866 and came to Ridgewood in the blizzard of March 1888 to visit his father and decided to set up his practice here. He rigged up his own telephone, the first in the area, made of cigar boxes, odds and ends and stringing his own wires. He wore out 28 horses and became the first County citizen to drive a horseless carriage — a 1900 Stanley Steamer. He was a personal friend of Woodrow Wilson and pioneered in the use of insulin and diptheria antitoxin. With his associate, Dr. William C. Craig, he organized Ridgewood's first hospital by building the large wing on this house. He treated his last patient when he was 97, ending a career in which he had delivered over 3,000 Bergen County babies. He died in 1966 at the age of 100.
