14. History:
The Hagan House was built during three different periods. Hawkins was a stage coach operator and the 1st person to run a mill through a court grant. The mill site is nearby on Silver Creek. Hawkins built the right portion of the house containing the rectangular log pen in the early 19th century. Caleb Stone added the left frame portion and the brick kitchen circa 1840. The house was sold around 1857 to the Hagans who operated a mill on Silver Creek. The Hagans sold the house to T.J. Curtis in 1878.

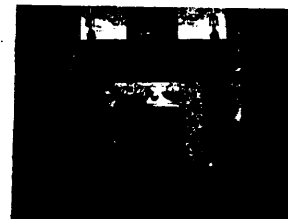

45. Description and House Plan:

The Hagan House is a two story, 6 bay frame residence with interior brick end chimneys. The right three bays are part of the original rectangular log pen structure. The first floor interior of the right side of the house has a stone firebox and the second floor mantel has a reeding reminiscent of the Federal period. The interior of the left side includes one room and the entrance hallway which were built in the mid 19th century have wide baseboards and heavy window surrounds.

The windows of the front facade are 6 over 6; the windows of the first floor of the left side are flanked by wood doric pilasters. The gable end on the right is plain while the gable end on the left has a triangular pediment in the gable returns. The foundation of the house is stone which has been stuccoed in some areas with concrete. The present porch is wider than the original and extends beyond the bay containing the entrance. A two story frame ell extends off the right side and has a two story open gallery. It is attached to the one story brick kitchen by a dogtrot which has been framed in. The brick on the kitchen is five course common bond with jack arches over the windows.

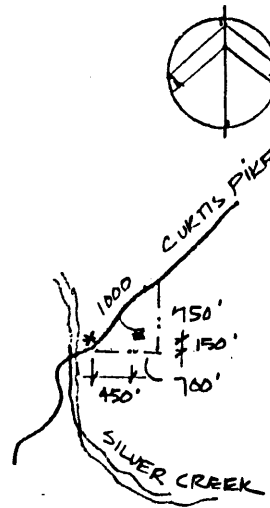
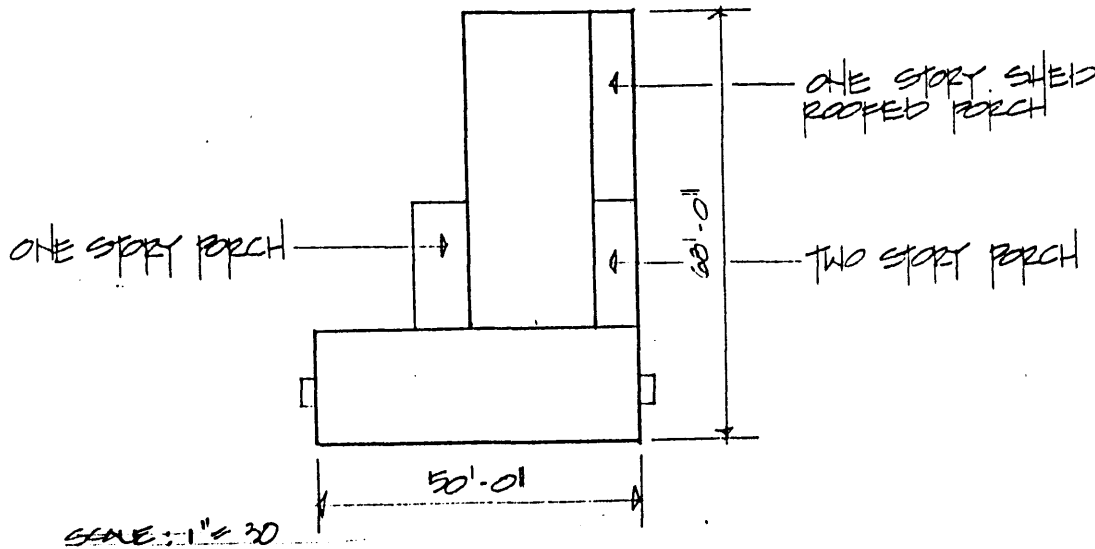

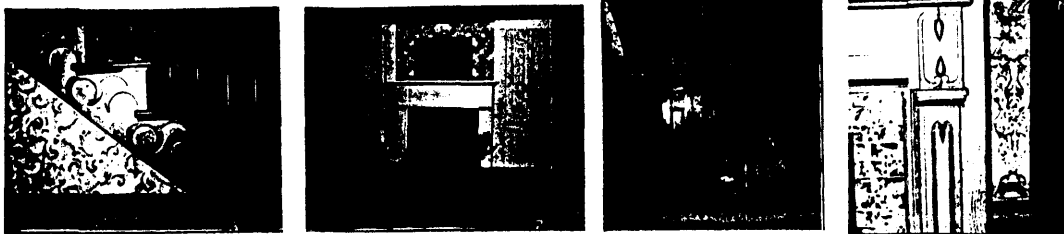

Statement of Significance

The Hawkins/Stone/Hagan/Curtis House is significant under criterion C for the period 1810 to 1835 as an example of how a rectangular log house was used in a remodeling as part of the main block of the house instead of an ell.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen arbitrarily to preserve the house's setback from the road (Curtis Pike) and to provide a minimal setting. The boundary on the north side is defined by the road. The south and east boundaries exclude areas not associated with the dwelling, but the farming operation.

The boundary includes one contributing building.
