As its name implies, Atkins' Ridge rests on a small hill located southeast of Greensboro, just off U. S. Highway 61. Atkins' Ridge, ca. 1840, is a significant example of a raised cottage, featuring a one story frame dwelling resting on a full brick basement. The cottage features a spraddle roof with exterior end chimneys; the roof material is asbestos shingles. A full width recessed porch supported by six tapered boxed columns runs the full width of the dwelling. The columns are connected by a delicate banister. The columns rest on brick piers which rise above the porch floor. Originally, the columns rested on piers which were even with the floor but they had deteriorated by the time of restoration and the present owners raised the height of the brick piers. The main floor is reached by a sweep of wooden steps. The five bay facade features a centrally placed double leaf entrance with full transom and sidelights. The flanking windows are 9/9 double hung sash.

The floorplan contains a central hall plan with the large principal rooms located on either side. The hall once opened onto a recessed rear porch which featured flanking cabinet rooms. Today, modern bathrooms are located in the cabinet rooms. One enters the recessed porch from the central hall through a rear double leaf entrance; this entrance features a full transom. The recessed porch has been enclosed by the present owners. A staircase on the rear porch descends to the basement level which originally contained an open breezeway and two principal rooms. Today, the breezeway below the central hall has been converted into a dining area. A small area for a utility room was excavated in the basement level.

Throughout the dwelling, one finds original mantles, moldings, doors and original hardware. The dwelling has undergone a sympathetic renovation which included the rebuilding of both chimneys and all brick piers and underpinnings. Although the exterior has been covered in alumninum siding, much of its original features have been retained. A modern garage and an office building are also located on the property. The office building was part of a later addition (late 19th century) to the house which was removed by the present owners during the restoration. The Atkins' Ridge nomination includes one contributing building and two non-contributing buildings.

#### **Criterion C: Architecture**

Atkins' Ridge, ca. 1840, is a significant example of an early Canebrake plantation house; the structure is also significant as one of the last remaining examples of a raised cottage in the region. The plantation house yields information regarding the styles, forms, construction methods, techniques and craftsmanship utilized by the residents of the Canebrake from 1830-1942. The dwelling retains a high degree of integrity in regard to design, materials, workmanship, feeling, and setting.

#### Historical Summary

Atkins' Ridge was constructed ca. 1840 by Mr. and Mrs. John Atkins. According to deed and land records, John Atkins owned approximately 480 acres land. The dwelling house was located on the northeast extremity of the plantation, adjacent to the heavily traveled Greensboro to Newbern highway (present day U. S. Highway 61). In 1911, Pascal Tutwiler purchased the property who in turn, bequeathed the dwelling house to his son, Pascal Tutwiler II. After the death of Mrs. Virginia Pope Tutwiler, the house was purchased in 1972 by Dr. and Mrs. James H. Payne, Jr. who have undertaken a complete restoration of the dwelling. <sup>1</sup>

### Archaeological Component

Although no formal archaeological survey has been made at Atkins' Ridge, the potential for subsurface remains may be high. Properties of this type were sited with a constellation of dependencies such as kitchens and other outbuildings. Buried portions may contain significant information that may be useful in interpreting the entire property.
