

#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The John E. McCallister House is a three-bay, two-story, central passage dwelling with a rear ell. The Greek Revival Italianate House was built in 1867 by John E. McCallister and is located and surrounded by a commercial strip development on the outlying section north of downtown Henderson and three blocks from the Ohio River.

The treatment of masses and the strong vertical proportions immediately identifies this house as being primarily Italianate in style. The central bay projects and emphasizes the mass and heaviness of the structure. The brick work is American bond and the center and two flanking bays are recessed and set off by contrasting vertical bands of brick.

The facade is articulated and embellished with carved wooden bracketed eaves and cornice strips with a very wide eave molding that features Greek Revival iron grillwork.

Fenestration consists of tall shallow narrow windows with bracketed hood moldings. The entrance door is topped by a wide rectangular transom although the porch seems to have been replaced at a later date.

The interior plan is formal, symetrical and square shaped. The interior features highly ornate plasterwork and generous molding decoration making this an exceptionally good example of this period. The Greek Revival woodwork around the doors and windows feature the dog ear design. The lower band of ceiling moldings in the front drawing room and in the parlor features the egg and dart design. The parlor also features a finely crafted center ceiling medallion.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Located and surrounded by a commercial strip development, the McCallister House is one of the few important examples of the transitional period houses of the Greek Revival/Italianate style remaining in Henderson. It has retained most of the significant original exterior and interior features characterizing the two styles.

Henderson County, Kentucky was formed in 1798 out of part of Christian County. It was the thirty-eighth county organized in the state by the Kentucky General Assembly. Named in honor of Col. Richard Henderson, one of the original pioneer founders in Kentucky, the county initially encompassed all of the territory out of which the present Hopkins County was formed in 1806, Union County in 1811 and Webster County in 1860. Located in the southwestern part of the state, Henderson County is a rich agricultural area, the Ohio River forming its northern boundary for seventy miles and the Green River watering the county for an additional forty miles. Henderson is one of the largest corn and tobacco producing counties in the state.

The county seat of Henderson was incorporated in 1810 and is located on the Ohio River, 196 miles below Louisville, and approximately eleven and one-half miles below Evansville, Indiana, as river traffic flows. It is also approximately 173 miles above Cairo, Illinois and about 170 miles from Frankfort. Henderson was an important railroad center and served as a major terminal point for the railroads serving the area.

The elaborate and excellent craftsmanship is apparent on the interior and can be clearly seen in the intricate and delicate cornice and plasterwork. The highly ornate medallions and mouldings exemplify the highpoint in this style and sets this house off from others of this period. Greek Revival woodwork around doors, window and frames all remain.
