7. Description

St. Nicholas Orthodox Church is located in a rural setting in the hamlet of Caribou in the remote northeastern corner of Kittson County. The small frame structure consists of a rectangular plan sanctuary, a central entrance tower, and a small rectangular apse. The sanctuary and apse have hipped roofs. The entrance tower has a large square first level topped by a slightly smaller square portion, which in turn is covered by a pyramidal roof. Double doors, with decorative wood designs, are set into a round arched entrance. The remaining fenestration consists of two double-sash rectangular windows on each side of the church and a single sash window at the rear of the apse.

Copper-colored onion domes project from the ridge line of the sanctuary and the apse. Both domes, as well as the tower, have Greek crosses formed of bent metal rod.

The interior is paneled with unpainted knotty boards. Chairs line each wall and face simple wooden benches. An iconostasis

dividing the sanctuary and apse is covered with religious icons and images.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

St. Nicholas Orthodox Church is significant for its association with Ukrainian settlement in northwestern Minnesota. In the late decades of the nineteenth century, many East Slavs migrated to Minnesota, North Dakota, and the prairie provinces of Canada. Ukrainians arrived in Kittson County shortly after the turn-ofthe-century, having moved south from the Winnipeg area in search Several small communities were established. of good farm land. One - that at Caribou - found itself in Minnesota after a 1909 American-Canadian border survey. The Caribou group built St. Nicholas Orthodox Church in 1905. The congregation continued to participate with the Ukrainian communities across the border in Manitoba, only a mile from the church. The church remained in regular use until the 1940s but since then has been used only for special occassions. The building has been maintained by former parishioners who live in the area. It continues to serve as an important symbol of the small ethnic community. Both interior and exterior are in good condition and are being well preserved.
