

Summary

The Moorefield School is a single story structure constructed by the National Youth Association in 1936-37. The building, designed in the Plain Traditional style, is typical of NYA/WPA-constructed school houses and features some Craftsman influences.

Elaboration

The Moorefield School is a single story school house constructed by the NYA in 1936-37. The plan is rectangular and consists of a full basement supporting fieldstone walls detailed with grapevine pointing. The walls are covered with a composition - shingled, gable on hipped roof. The rafters are exposed under the eaves in the traditional Craftsman style. The is one other interior chimney.

The western elevation features a parapeted porch. Two entry doors are nine panes each. The lower doors are cross hatched. There is a single nine over nine window with the upper sash covered with board fabric.

The southern elevation was originally fenestrated by three sets of six nine-over-nine double hung windows symmetrically arranged.

The eastern elevation features a stoop with shed roof and six nine-over-nine windows with board covered upper sashes.

The northern elevation features a second parapeted double entry porch and ten nine-over-nine windows with boarded over upper sashes.

The marker text reads "Created by National Youth Administration in Cooperation with Moorefield School District:

John Huskey - Secretary

A.E. Barnes, E.L. Manning, Paul B. Goodwin

The Moorefield School consolidated in Batesville system in 1947 and the structure now houses the Rehobeth Baptist Church.

Moorefield School

The town of Moorefield lies just four miles to the east of Batesville, where the White River emerges from the Ozarks; as such, Moorefield has always been dependent on the economic and industrial fortunes of its larger neighbor, the center of government and economic locus of Independence County. During the 1930's, Batesville and central Independence County was a major processing center for the agricultural and mineral products of both the upland Ozarks and the lowland Delta, from fruits, cotton, poultry, and dairy products to marble, manganese, and limestone. With the advent of the Depression, the economic livelihood of central Independence County took a downturn, and in 1936 the Works Progress Administration authorized the construction of a new school at Moorefield as a means of providing employment to the local citizenry.¹

The Moorefield School, constructed during the period covered by the historic context *The Evolution of the Public School System in the Arkansas Ozarks*, 1920-1940, is a representative example of a small stone school building constructed for a rural school district. Its documented construction by the N.Y.A. and its use during this period as a local school building clearly identify it with this historic context and with this property type. It is significant locally under Criterion A through its direct associations with both the history of the evolution of the public school system in the Ozark Mountain region of the state during this period and the N.Y.A.
