The Utica Public School is a two-story, tall narrow building constructed around 1910. It has a slightly pitched roof and prominent extended eaves. The building is faced with reddish brick with running bond course work and the the foundation is constructed of concrete material. A central bay projects from the east facade and is marked by a compound round headed arched entryway. Other features include quoins and flat topped lintels with radiating brick "voussoirs". The only modifications have been replacement of original windows.

SIGNIFICANCE

Vernacular 1910

The Utica Public School is significant locally to the resource area in archtecture and education. Although the building is vernacular in design, it remains one of the more impressive public buildings in Yankton County. Educationally it has served this region of the county, for over 60 years, and illustrates part of the growth and development of a rural community.
