

Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The Cary House in Pangburn is a good example of a one and one-half story, frame, irregularly shaped building. The hip roof slopes downward and terminates with a gable wing on the southwest corner of the building; the entire roof is covered with composition shingles. The first floor walls are still clad with novelty siding while the upper portions of the gable ends are still covered with their original weatherboard. They are also adorned with gable returns. This house rests on a concrete block foundation.

Located on the southeast comer of Searcy and Short Streets, this building was constructed within the Pangburn city limits. It was constructed c. 1910, and is still in good condition. The main, or west, elevation of the structure is dominated by a wrap-around porch that extends to a part of the south elevation. Its shed roof is supported by wooden box columns. Fenestration on this elevation consists of symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows. A gable roof dormer extends from the western slope of the hip roof on this elevation as well. The gable wing on the southwest portion of the building has chamfered corners and each of the wing's three bays are fenestrated with a single one-over-one double-hung sash window.

Fenestration on the south elevation of the original portion of the house is completed by a single symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash window. A one-story hip roof addition was attached to the east elevation of the original house. Its south elevation has a one-bay shed roof porch attached to it and this is supported by turned posts. The only window in this addition is located on the east elevation; it consists of a two-over-two double-hung aluminum sash window. Even this addition has been added to. A single room addition connects the north elevation of the hip roof addition to the east elevation of the original building. It has a window that is similar to the one found in the previously mentioned addition; this window is found on the north elevation. Single symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows adom the north elevation of the original building. The easternmost one, however, has been replaced by a smaller two-over-two double-hung aluminum sash window. Two corbelled brick chimneys rise from the interior of the hip roof.

Significance

When this house was constructed, c. 1910, it was one of numerous irregularly-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Even though there are sixty-six of these buildings still left in the county very few exhibit the amount of integrity found in Pangburn's Cary House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the eastern edge of Searcy Street with a perpendicular line running along the southern elevation of the house, proceed easterly along said line to its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the house's eastern elevation; thence proceed northerly along said line to its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the southern edge of Short Street; thence proceed westerly along said line to its intersection with the eastern edge of Searcy Street; thence proceed southerly along said line to the point of beginning.

The boundaries of this property are presently located along building lines. Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of the eastern edge of Searcy Street with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southern elevation of the house and located 50 feet to the south thereof; proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the eastern elevation of the house; thence proceed northerly for a distance of approximately 200 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the southern edge of Short Street; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with the eastern edge of Searcy Street; thence proceed southerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification:

The original lot has been subdivided during the non-historic period, resulting in an indefinite current lot boundary; therefore, this boundary includes all the property historically associated with this resource that retains its integrity.
