Summary

The Lake Village Confederate Monument is located east of the Chicot County Courthouse, facing east on the lake shore between Main and Jackson streets. The sculpture is of a Confederate soldier standing in mid-stride with his proper left leg forward. His proper right hand holds the rifle by the barrel with the butt to the ground. The figure is hatted with a bed roll draped over the proper left shoulder and tied at the hip. There appears to be a missing cannon barrel on the proper left base which seems to have once served as a fountain. Both the base and the sculpture are made of white marble. The base is 20'x12'x8'; the sculpture is 6'x2'x2'.

Elaboration

The Lake Village Confederate Monument is located east of the Chicot County Courthouse, facing east on the lake shore between Main and Jackson streets. The sculpture is of a Confederate soldier standing in mid-stride with his proper left leg forward. His proper right hand holds the rifle by the barrel with the butt to the ground. The figure is hatted with a bed roll draped over the proper left shoulder and tied at the hip. There appears to be a missing cannon barrel on the proper left base which seems to have once served as a fountain. Both the base and the sculpture are made of white marble. The base is 20'x12'x8'; the sculpture is 6'x2'x2'.

The front, or west, side of the base has two crossed Confederate flags under the inscription: "1861-1865 CSA / TO THE CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS OF CHICOT / COUNTY, THE RECORD OF WHOSE SUBLIME / SELF SACRIFICE AND UNDYING DEVOTION / IS THE PROUD HERITAGE / OF A LOYAL POSTERITY."

The east side of the base has the inscription "ERECTED BY THE / CAPTAIN McCONNELL / AND / GEORGE K. CRACRAFT / CHAPTERS, U.D.C. / A.D. 1910 / AND CHICOT COUNTY" followed by "WE CARE NOT WHENCE / THEY CAME, / DEAR, IN LIFELESS CLAY / WHETHER UNKNOWN OR KNOWN TO FAME / THEIR CAUSE AND COUNTRY STILL THE SAME / THEY DIED AND WORE THE GRAY./ FATHER RYAN."

Since it is currently located in the center of a very narrow street, some chips of 1" to 3" are missing from the corners of the base due to traffic. There is no graffiti on the monument but it is experiencing some sugaring on both the base and the sculpture. The south side marble cannon is missing,

exposing a 3/4" copper pipe that was probably part of the fountain.

The Lake Village Confederate Monument is associated with the historic context "Something So Dim It Must Be Holy": Civil War Commemorative Sculpture in Arkansas, 1886-1934 as a commemorative monument financed and erected through the efforts of an ancestral' organization in Arkansas. As such, it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the Capt. McConnell and George K. Cracraft Chapters of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to reflect members' perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause. Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criteria Consideration F: Commemorative Properties.

Elaboration

Unveiled on October 26, 1910, the Lake Village Confederate Monument was sponsored by the Capt. McConnell and the George K. Cracraft Chapters of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, both based in Chicot County. According to Leona Sumner Brasher's 1915 history of Chicot County, they raised \$3,000

for the memorial. Capt. Jacob McConnell was a member of the Chicot Rangers rifle company who died on September 20, 1863, probably from battle wounds. Capt. George K. Cracraft was part of the "Immortal Six Hundred," a group of captured Confederate officers who, in retaliation for a similar Southern treatment of Union soldiers, were subjected to the fire of their own guns in Charleston, South Carolina. This punishment, which lasted for about 40 days, took place in the winter of 1864. Capt. Cracraft survived the experience and went on to become a successful cotton planter in Lake Village.

The monument was originally located closer to the Chicot County Courthouse, but when the courthouse burned it was not rebuilt next to the monument. Eventually a street was built around the memorial, which remained in its original position. Since it is currently located in the center of a very narrow street, some chips of 1" to 3" are missing from the corners of the base due to traffic.






