Side modifications at the rear of the secondary facade are reversible, except the window which is now a door. It is at the rear and unobtrusive. This is the only example of Neo-Classical Revival style architecture in Safford, a prominent focal point on Main Street and one of two commercial buildings in the community that have retained sufficient integrity to be nominated to the National Register.
