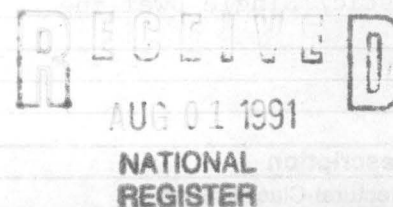

Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The David Doyle House is a good example of a one-story T-shaped building that is of frame construction and clad with both weatherboard and beaded board siding. The latter type of siding is found only on the west elevation of the house and is covered by the porch. The building has a gable roof that is covered with composition shingles and the entire structure rests on a stone foundation.

Located on the northeast corner of the intersection of County Road 953 and State Road 5, this building was constructed approximately one-quarter of a mile south of the proposed court square in El Paso. The David Doyle House was constructed c. 1904 and is in good condition. Its main, or west elevation is dominated by a hipped roof porch that extends the full length of the facade. The porch roof is supported by turned posts that are adorned with decorative wood ornament.

The original portion of the house is fenestrated with symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows. Three symmetrically placed doors open onto the porch from the buildings west elevation. The westward projecting gable end is the only elevation featuring any type of embellishment. The lower portion features chamfered corners while the upper portion is decorated with imbricated wooden shingles and jig-sawn verge detail. A gable roof rear "T" addition extends from the east side of the house. Its gable end is fenestrated with a centrally placed pair of three-over-one double-hung wood sash windows. Because of these windows it is believed that this addition was done in the mid 1920's when these windows were popular. Open porches originally flanked this addition. The ell-shaped porch on the north side has a hipped roof but is now enclosed and its fenestration consists of asymmetrically placed windows. They are either single or paired four-over-one double-hung wood sash windows or one-over-one double-hung aluminum sash windows. The porch on the south elevation of the addition is also enclosed with a single door located on its east side and a paired four-over-one double-hung wood sash window. Similar windows, although set in a ribbon arrangement, are located on the south elevation of this enclosed porch.

Significance

When this building was constructed, c. 1904, it was one of numerous T-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Though there are eighty-three of these buildings extant in the county, few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the David Doyle House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.

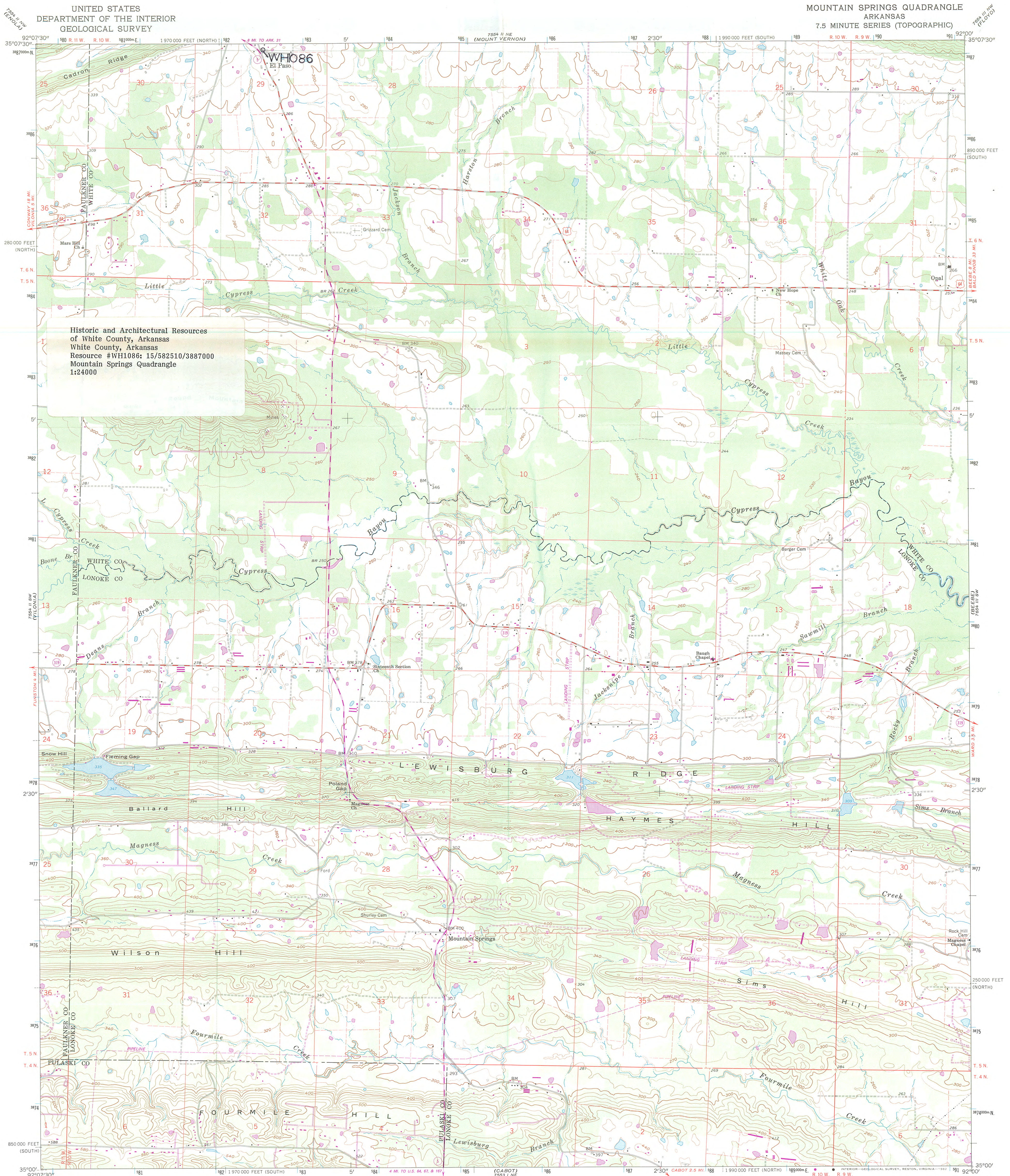
