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

From a point on the northeast corner of the lot of 1023 Riverside Drive; then south 150 feet along the west side of Riverside Drive to the SE corner of the lot; then west 110 feet along the south property line to the SW corner of the lot; then north 150 feet along the west property line to the NW corner of the lot; then east 110 feet along the north property line to the NE corner and the point of beginning.

The boundary contains one contributing structure and all of the domestic space associated with the McKee House.

Description and House Plan: 45.

The McKee House is a two-story, T-plan residence clad in weatherboarding. The front facade has three bays, two of which are in the main block of the house and the third bay in the stem of the "T".

A single bay, one-story, flat roofed porch supported by paired squared columns covers the entrance which contains a double-leafed door and transom. The porch cornice is embellished by small brackets and spandrels. The west side of the house has a two-tiered porch which covers the central bays of the four bay facade. On the southeast corner of the house is a recessed porch.

The windows are tall, narrow and slightly pedimented with one over one, double hung glazing. The windows are single on the south and west facades and doubled on the north and east. On the front facade, there is a semi-octagonal bay window with a bracketed cornice and panels.

The gable roof has overhanging eaves which are shown with bargeboards in earlier photographs. The bargeboards have been removed and the brick chimneys rebuilt. There arc still diamond-shaped windows and raking boards which end in pendants in all of the gables.
