

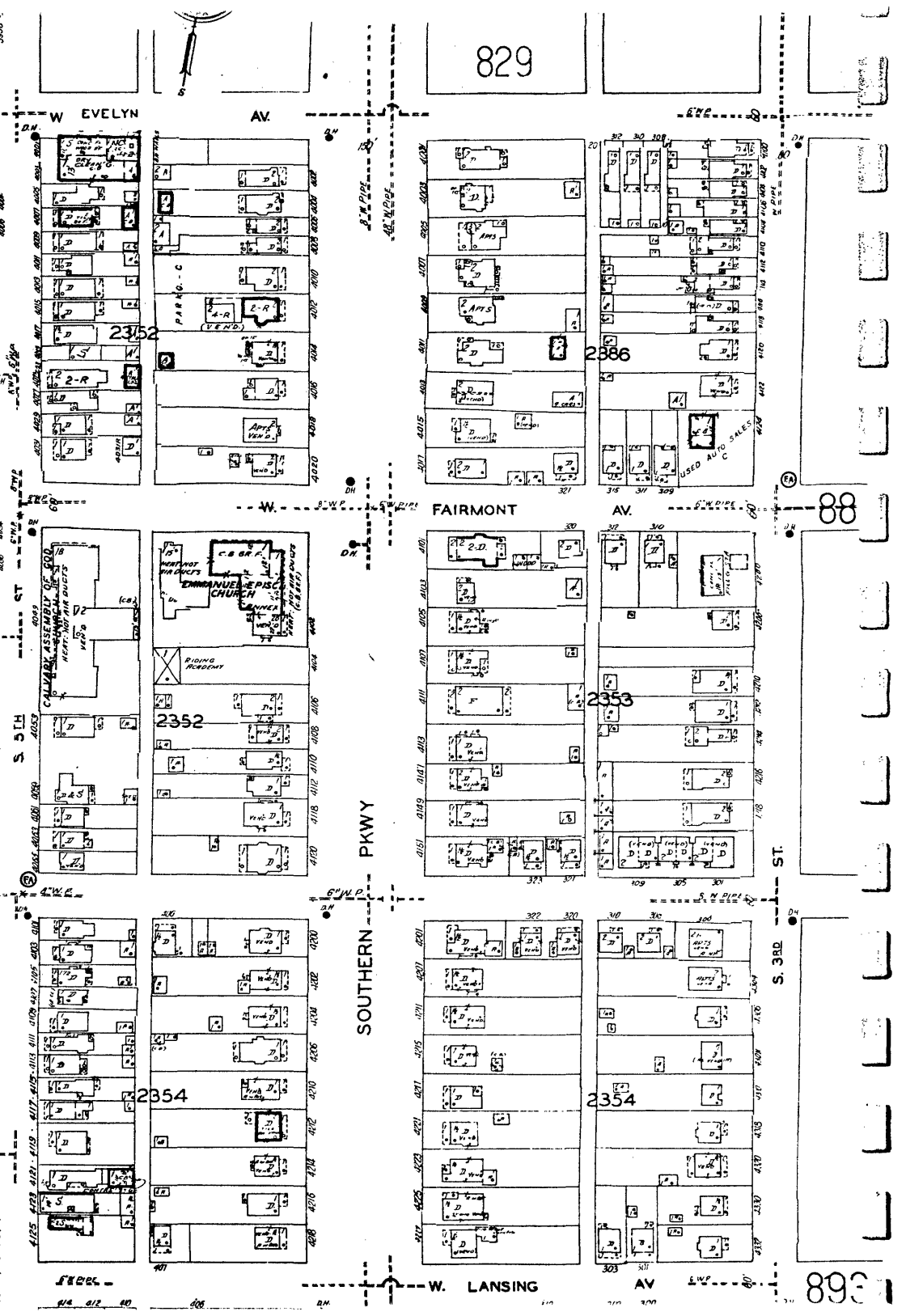
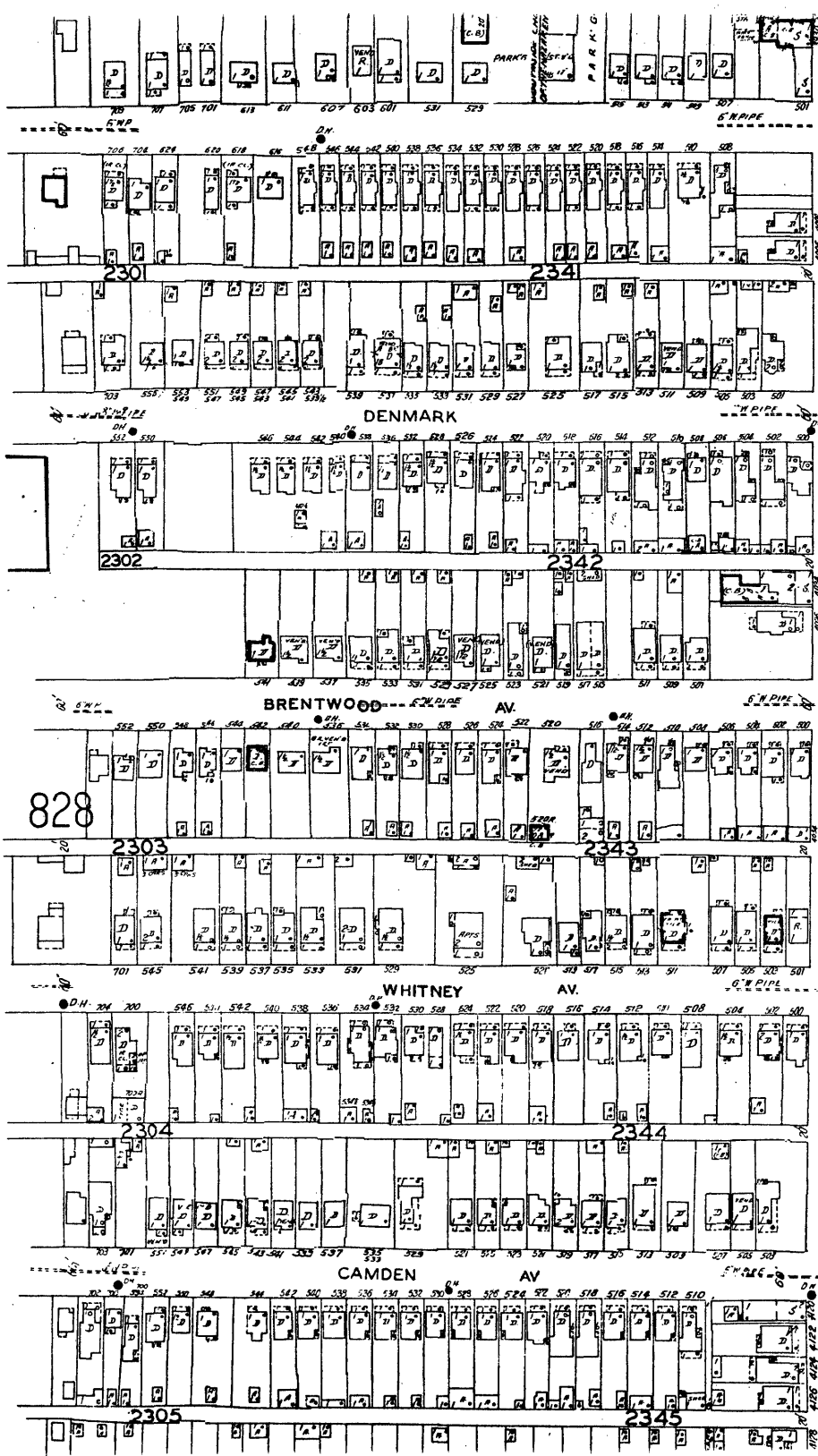

Larger lancet windows continue down both sides of the building and contain stained-glass.
