

Summary

The Matthews-MacFadyen House is one of three pre-Depression Edgemont houses erected on Dooley Road, Edgemont's secondary street. A highly picturesque example of the English Revival style, the house incorporates features such as decorative brickwork, prominent chimney stacks, and a steeply pitched roofline to evoke medieval English architecture.

Elaboration

Just two blocks long, Dooley Road simply connects one section of Skyline Drive with another section of the same, curvilinear street. Prior to the Depression, only three houses were built on Dooley, where lots do not enjoy the view across the Arkansas River toward Little Rock that is available along Skyline Drive. The Matthews-MacFadyen House is oriented to the north, on a site that originally comprised one-and-one-half lots.

The main two-story section of the house lies beneath a steeply-pitched gable-on-hip roof that is covered with wooden shingles. A double chimney stack, topped by decorative chimney pots, rises through the ridge of the main roofline.

A one-story ell, containing the living room, projects northward at right angles to the main section of the house. The ell has a steeply-pitched gabled roof with a cross gable that terminates in another chimney which divides into two stacks above the ridge of the cross gable, each stack topped by a decorative chimney pot. French doors are centered in the north end of the living room ell, and multi-paned casement windows flank the chimney on the east side of the ell.

The main entrance is located in the two-story section of the house, just east of the ell. The doorway is sheltered by a small wood-shingled roof, and above the door a section of brick is laid in herringbone bond, adding another picturesque touch to the house's already-picturesque brick veneer, which is laid unevenly with an occasional "misplaced" brick.

A pair of windows with six-over-six, double-hung sashes, located in the main (north) facade just east of the entrance, defines the location of the dining room. Above these windows, an oriel window projects from the main facade. Original windows elsewhere in the house all have six-over-six, double-hung sashes. A recent one-story addition to the rear (south) facade of the house has windows of fixed panes of glass.

The rear addition, which differs from the original house in having wooden siding, is the only major alteration the Matthews-MacFadyen House has undergone, either outside or inside. And, unlike some Edgemont houses, the Matthews-MacFadyen House has interior features that generally are consistent with its exterior architectural style. Among several noteworthy interior features are the living room's vaulted and beamed ceiling and the gallery which overlooks the living room from an upstairs hallway. Arched openings are not used as prominently in this house as in other Edgemont houses; they exist only in private areas of the Matthews-MacFadyen House, such as bathrooms.

Behind the house stands the original two-story garage-plus-maid's quarters, designed to accommodate two cars on its ground level. The gable-roofed structure features the same brick veneer, wooden shingles, and six-over-six, double-hung windows as the main house.

Summary

Criteria A and C, local significance

Like both of the other houses built on Dooley Road before the Depression brought construction in Edgemont to a halt, the Matthews-MacFadyen House was erected in 1930. They did not find a buyer until the early 1940's, thus--like several of its neighbors--it serves to illustrate the Depression's impact on Edgemont's development. Perhaps the most significant aspect of the Matthews-MacFadyen House, however, is its architecture, which incorporates some of the best and most picturesque detailing to be found among the Edgemont houses.

Elaboration

Constructed during 1930, the three houses on Dooley Road were the 13, 14th, and 15th (of a total of sixteen) Edgemont houses to be completed. Records suggest, however, that the Matthews-MacFadyen House is the "youngest" of the Dooley Road houses. It was, at least, the last to be occupied.

Unable to sell the house, Metropolitan Trust Company leased it in May of 1931 to Mr. and Mrs. N. R. Hughes for a total annual rent of \$1,020--or \$85 per month. Mr. and Mrs. Hughes were the first of at least four renters who occupied the house before it sold in the early 1940's to Mr. and Mrs. Donald J. MacFadyen. Mr. MacFadyen was vice-president of the North Little Rock Chamber of Commerce.

Though still owned by Mrs. MacFadyen, the house began being used a rental property again around 1950. When Mrs. MacFadyen eventually sold the house in 1965, it reportedly was in poor condition. The couple who purchased the house from Mrs. MacFadyen, Mr. and Mrs. John F. Blodgett, are credited by the present owner (who bought it from the Blodgetts in 1984) with having extensively rehabilitated the house.

Architecturally significant as an excellent example of the English Revival style, the Matthews-MacFadyen also has a "checkered" history that demonstrates the effects of the Depression on Edgemont's development.




