Intermediate boundary marker Southeast #5 is situated in an open field approximately 45 feet southeast of the centerline of Southern Avenue and 280 feet northeast of the centerline of Valley Terrace, S.E. The sandstone marker is in good condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, in fair condition, surrounds the marker.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located approximately 45 feet southeast of the centerline of Southern Avenue and 280 feet northeast of the centerline of Valley Terrace, S.E. The fence surrounds the stone.
