1(Q)	308 Jefferson Street(c.1895)	Two-story, Queen Anne/Colonial Revival structure. Wood frame construction covered with beveled siding. Two story porch wraps around south and east sides. Wooden porch columns and railing on first floor have been replaced by stucco covered masonry. Basic integrity of the building is intact.
2(C)	315 N. Broadway(c. 1895)	One-story, 'L'-shaped, vernacular cottage. Wood frame construction covered with beveled siding. East Lake wood work at front porch.

3(C)	323 N. Broadway(c. 1905)	Two-story, wood-frame, structure covered with beveled siding. Front porch with slender classical columns once had a circular, gazebo- like unit attached at the southeast corner, now removed.
4(M)	364 N. Broadway (c. 1915)	One-story, frame, bungalow with bracketed eaves. The building is now covered with ce- ment asbestos shingles. Front porch now supported by full-height brick piers.
5(M)	360 N. Broadway(c. 1915)	One-story, transverse-gabled, wood-frame cottage covered with narrow beveled siding. Front porch now supported by paired, square posts. One front window now boarded up. Building condition is generally deteriorated.
6(M)	354 N. Broadway(c. 1920)	One-story, transverse-gabled wood-frame cottage with beveled siding and central gabled entry porch supported by classical columns. Jig-sawn trim at eaves.
7(C)	346 N. Broadway(c. 1905)	One-story, 'L'-shaped cottage with front porch supported by square, classical columns and contained inside the ell. Beveled siding used throughout.
8(C)	342 N. Broadway(c. 1900)	One-story, 'L'-shaped cottage covered with beveled siding. Projecting gabled bay at left side of street front facade has chamfered corners with jig-sawn brackets. At the right side of this facade a porch addition (c.1920) has square, classical, wooden piers atop brick bases.
9(M)	336 N. Broadway(c. 1900)	One-story, wood-frame cottage covered with beveled siding. Front porch has Queen Anne style turned columns and jig-sawn brackets.
10(C)	330 N. Broadway(c. 1905)	Two-story, wood-frame structure with double, front-facing gables. Beveled siding with some cement asbestos siding at rear. Transverse one-story, shed-roofed, front porch with exposed rafter ends supported by turned columns.

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

11(M)	326 N. Broadway(c. 1905)	Two-story, four-square, wood-frame block now covered with cement asbestos shingles. Transverse, one-story, front porch supported by classical columns.
12(C)	322 N. Broadway(c. 1900)	One-story, four-square block with front- facing gable and one-story, transverse front porch supported by classical columns atop brick piers. Queen Anne style textured wood work inside gable. Roof currently corrugated metal.
13(C)	316 N. Broadway(c. 1900)	One-and-one-half story, wood frame structure with front-facing gable having chamfered corners at left side of facade. New one-story entry porch with turned columns probably quite similar to original porch as indicated by foundation walls.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The buildings in the North Broadway Historic District illustrate the Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, and Bungalow Styles which were popular nationally from about 1880 to 1925. They represent a rare example of an intact late- nineteenth and early twentieth century Tupelo streetscape, in a community which saw most of its pre-1936 housing stock destroyed in a devastating tornado.

Tupelo is situated on land ceded by the Choctaw Indians in 1830 at the Treaty of Dancing Rabbit Creek. The town was platted in 1860 as a speculative venture in anticipation of the arrival of the Mobile and Ohio Railroad. Tupelo soon became prosperous in rural trade. (V. Grisham, Jr., "Tupelo, Mississippi From Settlement to Industrial Community" [Diss., Univ. of N.C. at Chapel Hill, 1975], 34). In 1866 the town was made the county seat and by 1874 a courthouse was located on the site of the present structure. Development occurred at this time in the blocks around and to the north of the courthouse as shown in the attached map of conditions in 1870. In 1887, the arrival of a second railroad, the Kansas City, Memphis, and Birmingham, signaled a boom period for the city (Grisham, 85) as it became a lumber and agricultural center for Northeast Mississippi. And it was during this period that the majority of the buildings in the North Broadway Historic District were constructed.

However, on April 5, 1936, a tornado struck the city. It first touched down along Main Street and then moved in a northeasterly direction, destroying much of the older portions of the town. The buildings in the North Broadway Historic District were just outside this path of destruction. 




