DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Holy Fellowship Church is a one story clapboard church with a cruciform floor plan. The church has a gable roof with wood shingle covering and jenkin heads on the wings. A rectangular bell tower with a flaring pyramidal termination and later cross finial appears at the center of the structure. Most of the windows have paired lancet arches over rectangular panes of glass, with muntins used for division. Other features include two doors, enclosed entry, semi-circular shape and star bursts applique. A parish house accompanied the church until it was destroyed in 1974 by fire. The structure remains much as it did in 1886.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1869 several delegations of Yankton Sioux, who about ten years earlier had accepted confinement to 400,000 acres west of Choteau Creek, went to the Santee Mission across the Missouri River in Nebraska to request missionary establishments at the Greenwood Agency. It was an extraordinary request, for the Yankton people had not had a great deal of contact with missionaries before; they had always lived in a state of semi-isolation.

Two churches responded by sending missionaries to the reservation. In 1870 John P. Williamson established Williamson Presbyterian Chapel in Greenwood. Episcopal Father Hinman acted first in 1889 by sending Reverend Paul Mazkute to begin the Christian work, then in 1870 by assigning Reverend Joseph W. Cook to construct Holy Fellowship Episcopal Church. Cook, besides being the principal leader of the church until his death in 1902, opened up other missionary posts and established the first and principal boarding school on the reservation. The church's records showed that by 1886 there were over 836 conversions to Christianity. Also that year a new chapel replaced the old and still serves as a center for worship.

The significance of the church architecturally is that it represents the type of structure built for missionary posts on the reservation. Over the years abandonment, destruction, and disasters have reduced these chapels to but a few and the ones remaining deserve recognition for their design as well as their history.

The chapel's importance exists in the central role it played in the conversion of the Yankton people. Holy Fellowship and Williamson Presbyterian Chapel were the principal mission stations for the important tribe of some 2,000 Yankton Indians in the latter nineteenth century.
