## 45. Description and House Plan:

Single-cell, two-story, dry-laid ashlar ice house, 9 x 12 feet. Gable roof (now gone) extended on east gable end to cover stairways and well (see plan). Steps descend from north and south sides, outside and against east wall of ice house, to landing outside entrance to lower room (ice pit). Twelve inch tall joists between floors were filled with sawdust to insulate ceiling of ice room, which is floor of upper room, used for food storage. Masonry is carefully squared, tooled, and laid in courses of alternating height. Lower portion of building has rough faced masonry. Stone is Tradewater Formation of Middle Pennsylvania limestone; is golden tan color, sandy textured. Small openings on sides of each floor have mitered frames and vertical diamond bars. Well house had open sides and board and batten wall on east end (roof and wall now gone).


Ice house located behind two-story, double-cell, log house having exterior stone chimneys in each gable end. Enclosed corner stairs in each room along center wall. Has two Greek Revival mantels (later?), beaded board walls around stairs. (Original) plan has one door into each room on east front and west rear with windows above each door on second floor. One small attic window in each gable end beside chimney.


House sheathed in weatherboard and windows cut into front wall beside door. Portico and rear kitchen added.


Separate kitchen at rear now gone. Other buildings gone.
