

18. Description

Edgewood is a 2½ story structure with a five-bay facade and small rectangular attic windows. During recent interior work, it was discovered that the main block of the house is a brick structure covered with clapboarding. The roof is a low, hipped roof and there are interior brick chimneys and small brackets beneath the cornice. The Palladian window and the wide, columned veranda were added about 1905. The two-story wing on the north was added about 1915.

19. History

Edgewood is thought to have been built by John B. McFerran after his father, James C. McFerran, acquired part of the Berry Hill farm (JF-552) in 1868. The senior McFerran established a trotting horse-breeding farm and changed the name to Glenview Stock Farm. In 1905 the house and a 10 acre tract of land was purchased by John W. Price, secretary and later a vice president of Belknap Hardware and Manufacturing Company. The Price family used the house as a summer home. Mr. Price added the Palladian window and the veranda soon after buying the property. The house was owned by Price descendants until 1981.

20. Significance

The main block of Edgewood is a handsome example of an Italianate country house. It is one of a very few late 19th-century summer homes in the Glenview area. (see JF-542 and JF-543.) The Colonial Revival details which were added around 1905 and 1915 are consistent with architectural trends of that era and, overall, do not detract from the building's integrity.

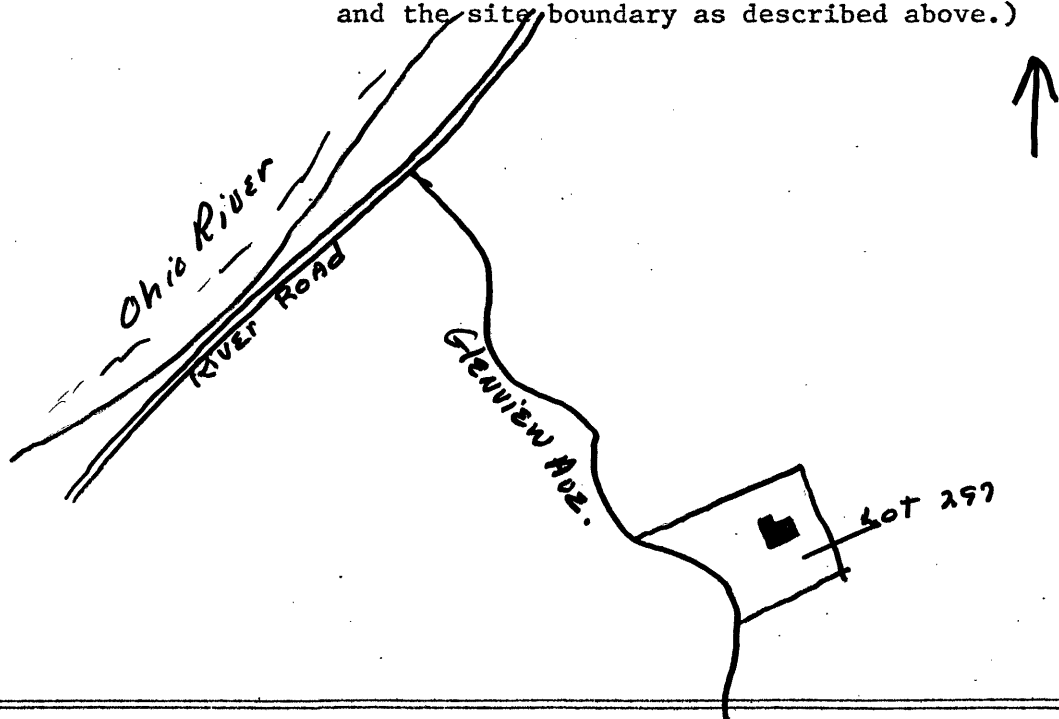
