Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Summary: The Redfield/Romine house is a local example of the Colonial Revival Style popular during the railroad era in Benson from 1893 (when the style became popular nationwide) until 1910. Local residents believe the house was built in the mid to late 1890s. It was owned by Benson postmaster Leonard D. Redfield, who came to Benson in 1896. The house has been preserved by its current owners.

Location & Setting: Located at 146 E. 6th Street, the Redfield/Romine house occupies its original lots 24 and 25 of Block 30 in the Town of Benson. The front yard is symmetrical with a central walk between a wood fence and two large, deciduous trees.

**Construction:** The structure is redwood framing on a foundation of redwood posts. The floor is raised above a crawl space and there is an attic above the ceiling. The walls are clad in wood, tongue and groove siding. The roof is sheathed with composition shingles.

Original Appearance: The square house featured a pyramidal roof with ventilated front gablet, a central panel door with leaded glass, paired one-over-one-light double hung windows and a front veranda with Queen Anne Revival Style detailing, including turned posts, brackets and spindles. The interior included a kitchen plus pantry, living room, dining room and bedroom. There was no bathroom. The interior had wooden floors with heavy baseboards, redwood wainscotting in the kitchen, carved wood casings around doors, redwood crown molding at the ceilings and five-panel interior doors.

Current Appearance: The exterior and much of the interior of this house are original and carefully preserved. In 1932, a porch, bathroom and bedroom addition was built to the rear. Currently, the pantry is being converted into a closet for the master bedroom. Kitchen cabinetry is original but the ceiling, flooring and counter tops have been replaced. Carpeting now covers the original pine flooring. The house has been repainted.

Significance: The Redfield/Romine house is locally significant under National Register Criterion C as an excellent example of a wood frame, Colonial Revival Style house. It is significant for its contribution to architectural development in Benson from 1880 to 1942. The Colonial Revival Style was very popular in Benson and most of the houses constructed from 1898 to 1910, while Benson was still a major railroad junction point, were of this style. With minor modifications and a discreet addition to the rear, which was built before 1942, the house reflects a high degree of architectural integrity and is in good condition.

Early Resident: Leonard D. Redfield had an illustrious and well-publicized career as Benson's first postmaster, having served forty- four years in that position. A pioneer Arizonan, Redfield was born in 1867 in Olean, New York. The family moved west and eventually settled in Redington, Arizona (named for his father). At one point, his father handled a 218-mile pony express service from Tres Alamos (near Benson) to Riverside (near present-day Winkelman). At the age of 12, Leonard rode the 24-hour trip twice each week. In 1896, when Benson had grown large enough to need a postmaster, Leonard Redfield was appointed by president Grover Cleveland. It is not known when Leonard Redfield purchased the property at 146 E. 6th Street and whether he was the original occupant. In 1940 he was noted for being the "oldest postmaster in the United States in age as well as continuous service." Leonard D. Redfield made an important contribution to the history of postal transport and postal service in Arizona. He also served as mayor of Benson at the time it became incorporated in 1925.

Integrity: Other than the sensitive addition to the rear, there have been no substantive changes to the Redfield/Romine house which remains an excellent example of the Colonial Revival Style, significant in Benson's history.

















BENSON HISTORIC RESOURCE MAP BENSON, ARIZONA
