DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Tulsa's Convention Hall is a four story red brick building constructed in 1913 to serve as both Convention Hall and Municipal Theater. Sited in Tulsa's oldest commercial district, Convention Hall's distinctive shape and massive size are still identifiable reminders of its past use.

The low wide lines of the building are emphasized by horizontal courses of brick at the ground floor and above the third floor level, and by concrete geometric designs on the south elevation. The original south elevation facade featured a balustraded portico supported by two square columns. Two story bays flanking the portico were lighted by double hung windows. On the east and west elevations sixty eight double hung windows provided cross ventilation and light.

Major exterior changes occured in 1953. The building's north end was extended to create additional dressing room space and the front elevation portico and steps were replaced by a two story blond brick addition which provided needed mezzanine and ground floor lobbies. Although most of the windows were bricked in at that time and the street front elevations painted light green, the building retains sufficient architectural integrity to convey its social and cultural contributions to Tulsa from 1913 through 1977.

The interior space has undergone repeated remodeling. The balcony and 128 foot by 117 foot main auditorium remain.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Convention Hall is a reminder of Tulsa's early and continued committment to cultural and commercial progress. Financed by city bonds, the \$100,000 building was an ambitious project for the young community of only thirty thousand and was an attempt to compete regionally for more of the growing convention business.

Billed as the largest hall between Kansas City and Houston, Convention Hall showcased many great artists of the twentieth century including Caruso, Ethel Barrymore, Jolson, Pavlova, Isadora Duncan, Rachmaninoff, and Paterewski. Among the events associated with the building are Tulsa's first grand opera, Oklahoma's first major convention (1918 gathering of the Sons of the Confederacy) and, in 1923, the first International Petroleum Exposition. During Tulsa's 1921 race riot, Convention Hall served as a detention center for blacks.

Although its architectural integrity was compromised by the 1953 addition, "The Old Lady of Brady" (as she came to be called), was at the center of Tulsa's social and cultural life for more than sixty years. In continual use as a Convention Hall and Municipal Theater from 1913 to 1977, it is now privately owned and the interior is being renovated for use as a country western nightclub.


Present rehabilitation plans do not include removal of the 1953 addition, but National Register designation could encourage such a future porject.
