

This house, while having been altered through the years, still retains a sufficient amount of its original fabric that it should be recognized and retained. We are therefore including it for its architectural significance, for its association with the exploration and settlement of		

the Bergen County area, and for its remaining historic fabric. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.



Research by Elliot Hempstead and Louise Burnett states that house was rebuilt by Garret Thomas Hopper in 1810, and that wing is older, but modernization of interior makes dating difficult. Chrissie Hopper, 91 years old, states that the garret was not finished off and stairway added until after she moved away in 1894. Earl Reeves owned the house from 1924 to 1971 and L.T. Dorian from 1971-78 when the present owners bought.
