## SIGNIFICANCE:

In 1850 the county seat was moved to Buoma Vista. This building has there could as a Masonic Lodge Hall and as a general store. It is not unlike the plan of the old Chattahochee County counthouse, now at Westville, a restored 1850 community. It is an excellent example of the Carpenter Style and one of two wooden courthouse remaining in the state.

The weekly <u>Columbus</u> (<u>Ga.)Enquirer</u> reported on Dec. 22, 1846 in a "Notice to Builders" that bids were being accepted the following January for this building. "Brick masons and carpenters" were urged to attend.
