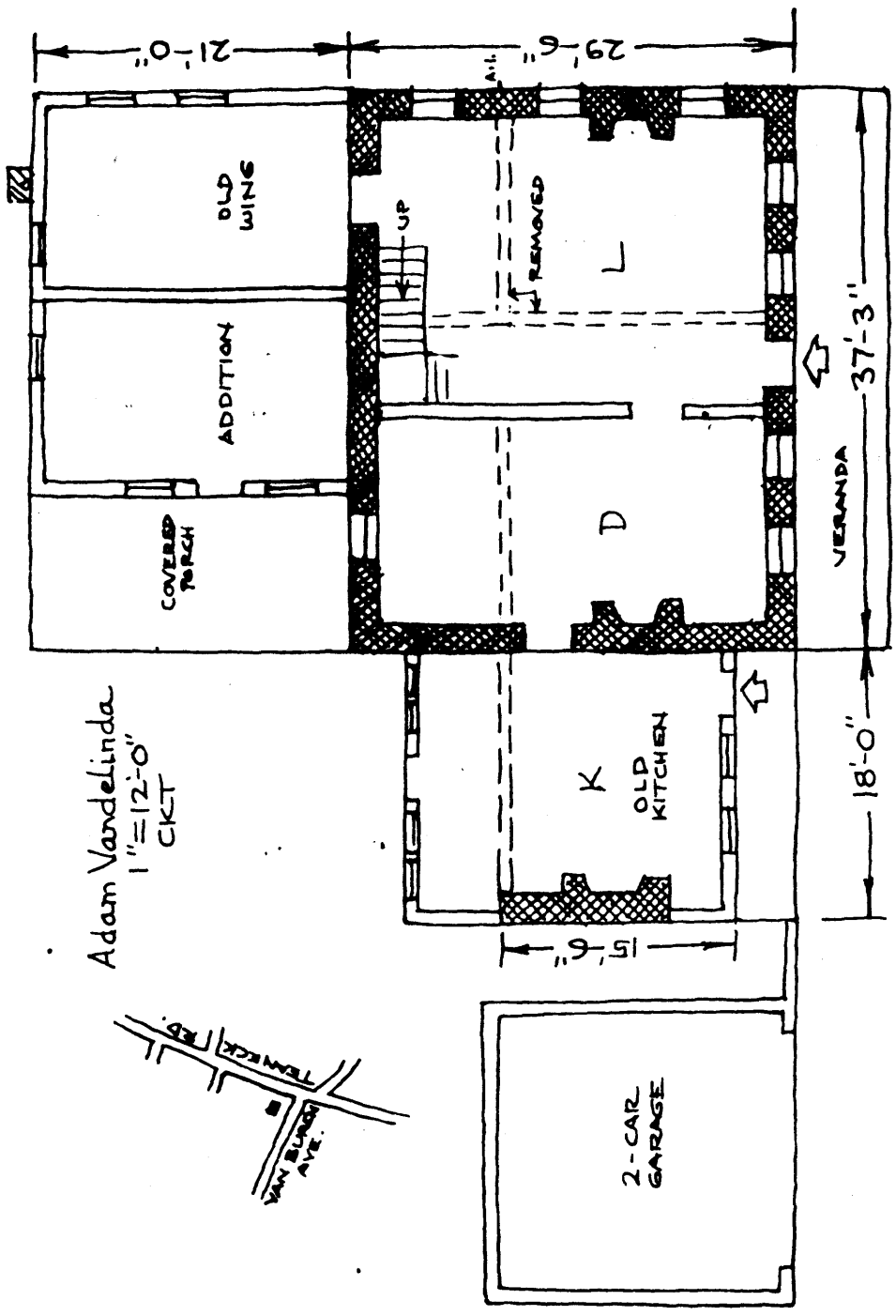

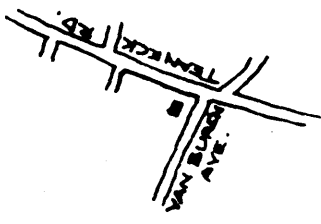
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LOCATION: 586 Teaneck Road, Teaneck

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This land was part of the Kiersted Patent of 1686 and James Vandelinda, a descendant of Roelof and Peter Vandelinda, bought a tract in 1804 for his sons James and Adam who built their houses. This house was sold after the Civil War to R. H. Johnson, a lawyer for William Walter Phelps. Benjamin Parker then sold it to Frank Larkin in 1913. The present owners bought the house in 1953 from a Dr. Clark who had owned it for two years.
