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DESCRIBE THE P	RESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APREARANCE

Burrages End is a small one-and-one on algorithm frame gambrel roof house located on a hillock in southern Anne Arundel County, Maryland.<sup>S</sup> Beneath its leanto porch on the south facade is a door, east of which are two windows with 9/6 sashes. On the second story are two shed dormer windows. <sup>O</sup> Above the overhanging box cornice and also under the porch roof is a short kneewall covered with riven oak clapboards tapered and overlapped with beaded edge. This latter feature indicates the presence of a leanto porch in the eighteenth cen-On the east gable are two exterior chimneys, the tury. north one having been reconstructed by the present (1972) owners and incorporated into a new kitchen wing. The north facade has the same fenestration as the south; however, the area of the leanto porch has been made into an additional room, and a smaller porch was added over the doorway. Since the pitch of the leanto porch on the south differs from the leanto on the north, the west gable is very irregular in outline and fenestration. The grey house with white trim stands on a brick and stone foundation.

From evidence found in the cellar, the original house appears to have been approximately 24 feet square, 1 but instead of having exterior chimneys, it had two interior fireplaces, one of which was in a corner. The walls were filled with brick nogging, a portion of which remains beneath the stair.

The present floor plan consists of two rooms serviced by the exterior fireplaces and a side hall. The north addition, constructed in the early nineteenth century, is a continuation of the dining room, a passage, and a lavatory. In the two rooms and side hall, the ceiling joists are exposed and beaded on each corner, as are the plates and corner posts. On the second floor, there are two bedrooms, a dressing room, and bath with exposed unfinished ceiling joists. Before the restoration, the attic floor was covered with riven oak clapboards, but these have been removed and the attic made into a useable storage area.

There is a possibility that the first floor room and passage on the south side was one large room, as the studs are said to be toenailed into the flooring. This is in contrast to the studs let into the floor between the stair hall and Judging from the beaded beams and six-panel dining room. doors hung on H-L hinges, the house appears to have been constructed in the period 1720-1740.

East of the house is a small frame building of early date which was either a kitchen or guarters. The garage, the guest house, and the chicken house are built in an arc east and south of the house. The anchor of the composition, lo-

cated at the bottom of the hillock, is an eighteenth-century tobacco barn, now used for other purposes. Its framing is very unusual and should be recorded as an outstanding eighteenth-century structure.

IThe 1798 Federal Direct Tax Assessment, Particular List of Dwellings, Anne Arundel County, West River and Herring Creek Hundred, describes the building as a wooden structure twenty-six feet by twenty-four feet, valued at \$200.
