DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The original mill, a two-and-one-half story frame building, is still standing. (Its construction date is unknown. Tradition dates it ca. 1814 but the first contemporary account is 1839.) This original section of the mill, measuring about twenty-five feet in width and thirty-five feet in length, has a steep gabled roof. A projecting pent roof is located between the first and second levels. On the rear of the nineteenth century mill, a shed dormer window faces the water wheel.

The floor plan has been altered over the years as illustrated by a 1920 photograph. Other rooms on the present structure include two gabled-roof sheds attached to the north of the original section. The central shed is also two-and-one-half stories; the north shed is a story-and-a-half. Both are of rough hewn horizontal planks. The mill contains machinery (original corn mill and stones) once used for grinding corn. At present this machinery is not being used; however, it could be put into working condition. [Mechanisms for producing wheat no longer in mill.]

The mill closed all operation around 1950.

<u>Surroundings</u>: Gilreath's Mill is located directly beside Highway 101. The water wheel, separate from the mill, is southwest of the frame structure. The mill stands in a wooded area. When it was in operation, the Shoal Creek and Clear Creek waters of the South Tyger River furnished the mill's power.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Gilreath's Mill is one of the few remaining mills in South Carolina that recalls the vital tradition of rural industry. Production of cornmeal and flour was essential to the people living nearby and therefore to the economic structure of the area. An example of the production levels of the mill is found in the South Carolina Industrial Census of 1860. Owned at that time by John Heller, the mill produced 1750 pounds of cornmeal and 60 bushels of flour. Value of this annual yield was \$1750 for the cornmeal and \$420 for the flour. Cornmeal and flour were strong commodities on a state-wide level. In 1882, for example, Gilreath's Mill was one of 720 grist mills in South Carolina producing 22% of all manufactures, second only to cotton products.

More than a statistic in state and local commerce records, a mill was an important element, both economically and socially, to those who depended on it. The first contemporary reference to Gilreath's Mill is in a diary entry dated April 10, 1839, recorded by Washington Taylor. Taylor, a local farmer who later bought the mill, served for one term in the South Carolina State Legislature. His journal covers a period of twenty years -- January 1, 1835 to January 1, 1855. Entries that mention the mill include the following:

April 10, 1839: "Wednesday took 25 bushels of wheat to Gilreath's Mill and hauled some rails."

July 25, 1840: "Saturday went to Gilreath's Mill with $8\frac{1}{2}$ bushels of wheat and got back 318 pounds of good flour."

The mill changed hands during the span of the diary, as reflected in an entry of February 25, 1852: "Wednesday sowed oats and chopped track to timber. Helped Mr. Heller about his mill."

The mill was an integral part of the social and economic setting of the area. A means of procuring staple foods, Gilreath's Mill was also a place where people could congregate. The mill remains today an important vestige of nineteenth century rural America.
